TOURNAMENT DIARIES

FRIDAY, January 21st: After a four hour drive up from L.A. we arrived at the Las Vegas Club at 2pm for the Second Annual Las Vegas Club Silver Strike Tournament. Right after checking in, which was fast and easy, we headed over to the elevator at the North Tower and passed Carol's Corner, named after our own Carol Heinz. This is right off the hotel lobby and there is a bank of deuces wild machines and there was Carol herself, Pam Martin, Carol Chrzanowski and Sue Cohenour - the guys were at the Silver Strike machines. We stopped and chatted for a bit and then went up to our room. Unpacked, headed downstairs and the big event had begun

Our first destination was the Silver Strike machine area where everyone was hanging out. The LVC had managed to have their new set of six Silver Strikes in play by that day so the strike machines were busy and a crowd had gathered to wait their turns and gossip. The rest of the bunch was down at the Four Queens winning red capped strikes right and left. Some people had a slow time of it and others had the Silver Strike angel on their shoulder as strike after strike dropped from the tubes into the chute. These machines are fun!

The welcome reception and tournament registration started at 4pm. Cocktails were hosted by the casino, a great buffet was being enjoyed by everyone and the tournament registration table was in full swing as Emily Fitzsimmons and Sue Cardona greeted all the guests. Freddie Maatouk, our tournament director, took the mike and welcomed us all and gave out tournament information. It was a terrific beginning to what would end up quite an experience for some.

After the banquet we all took off for an evening of fun. Freddie had told us that as a group our player cards so to please use them whenever we played would register our play. It was evident that we would meet our quota, as we were everywhere.

SATURDAY, January 22nd: Breakfast was early and tasty and as we all said good morning it was evident the crowd was ready to start. Players assembled at the tournament area early as the first round of play was at 9pm. At 9pm sharp the tournament began. Freddie, once again, had the mike and made each session fun, introducing each player, urging everyone on to hit the double diamonds, and setting a mood of excitement. Scores were kind of average so everyone was in the mix.... that was until round five.

The double diamonds were not very generous until round five, which I was in, and the machines started to sing. And whom did they sing for? Montana Mike was the chosen one. Mike Seyfert hit the double diamonds, and then hit them again and I think a third time, I am not quite sure as I had just hit them and watched my own score climb to over 5,000. But Mike was unstoppable and by

the time the round was over he had over 10,000 points. He broke all the records.

The Casino had never ever recorded a 5 digit score in one round of play as long as Freddie could remember. There were some big scores in round five, but we still had two more sessions to play and nothing is guaranteed.

The afternoon session began at 1pm and scores were significantly higher but everyone was waiting for round five to see if Mike could repeat. Well, he did. Not quite so high but came in with a 6,000 score for a total of over 16,000 for two rounds of play. He could have slept through the third session, but he was not convinced. A lot of scores had crept up and one good round on Sunday could change everything. There was just a general feeling of good will for everyone since we knew that the winners were going to be in our own group.

Saturday night was our club meeting and trade session. It began at 6pm back in the banquet room and by the time I arrived, promptly at 6, the room was full. Huge round tables filled with collectors and their Silver Strikes. I have never seen a trading session so big and with so much to choose from and all Silver Strikes. There was a short meeting lead by Don Nesbitt and Doug Conley and a great dessert buffet, which the club sponsored. Even if you were not trading or buying there were some great items to look at. One of the best trading sessions I have ever attended.

Besides the tournament, those of us who were not playing for Silver Strikes were playing for serious money, and there were some big jackpots this weekend. Lloyd Malani hit a huge one, Christie Gregory hit a few good ones and the last time I saw Pearl McFadden she had 5 large cups of \$1 tokens and was hitting 4 of a kind too often to count. We probably made our play quota on these three players.

SUNDAY, January 23rd: After another nice breakfast, courtesy of the hotel, with friendly service, we started gathering at the tournament area to see what this day would bring. It was pretty much a foregone conclusion that Montana Mike would win, but he was not convinced. Session 3 found us both in line and I picked machine #13 and promptly threw the ping-pong ball back in the basket. Not my lucky number and Mike came along and drew it right after me. Well, it worked for him. Another big score over 4,000 points. Now he knew he was in the money, but he was not sure it would be first place. There had been some other high scores and he was not yet counting his money.

2pm was Awards time and we all gathered expectantly to see what the final scores would be. Beverages and cake were served, compliments of the hotel, and the ceremony began. There were 15 cash prices plus the Tournament Token that had been beautifully designed and minted by club member, Richard Nelson's company. Each entrant would get the numbered souvenir token according to his or her placement in the tournament. Prizes 15 to 4th place were handed out, along with the corresponding numbered token. But, once again we had a big

surprise as Freddie got down to the 2nd and 3rd place prizes. The two places had tied. This was exciting as the winners; Vicky Bagdriwicz and Jim Tenley were given a choice of a play-off or splitting the prize money. They both graciously split the prize money and everyone cheered. Then it was Mike's turn and you guessed it. First place for \$5000 and he set all records at the LVC for high round, high score, high everything. He was awarded the current Champion T-Shirt by Norm Chrzanowski, last years' winner, which had been made by Richard Rosales who was unable to attend but provided the winner's T-Shirt, a tradition that we hope will continue.

Freddie then called each name in order of their placement in the tournament to come up and collect their token. Now there were 200 of these beauties minted so each person got to buy another one for \$40 and names were drawn so each player could pick the number they wanted. An odd irony of the day was during the draw for the remaining tokens Mike's name was drawn dead last. Not that it mattered to him, but it was just one more interesting thing that happened at this tournament.

MONDAY, January 24th: Time for most of us to go home and as we sat in Carol's Corner putting in our last twenty dollar bill before hitting the road back to L.A. people leaving would stop and say goodbye. We were all talking about seeing each other at the August Convention and what fun next year was gong to be at the Third Annual Las Vegas Club Silver Strike Tournament in 2006.

WEEKEND REVIEW: Although we only had 101 players more people showed up for the trade session and perhaps next year more will be able to make it to the tournament. This was an event to be remembered and thanks to the LVC, Freddie, Emily and Sue and the rest of his staff, and especially our own members, Gary Heinz, Pam Martin, Don Nesbitt, Doug Conley and Richard Nelson for making this such a great club function. If I have left anybody out, my apologies as everyone did a superb job. Put this event on your calendar for next year because you will not be disappointed.

SILVER STRIKES OF NORTHERN MINNESOTA

Hello everyone. Since the last newsletter, some of us traveled to Las Vegas for the tournament at the Las Vegas Club. It was a huge success and if you didn't make, try to come next year. I know you're probably getting tired of hearing this but you'll understand once you've been to one. Many thanks to everyone who made it possible.

This edition we'll go over strikes that were won at casinos in Northern Mississippi. Since Mississippi had so many great strikes, I'll break it up and do Northern Mississippi and Southern Mississippi. As you'll see, Mississippi strikes are all about the logo.

Bally's Casino in Tunica had a total of 15 silver strikes with 3 different logos, all with the GDC mint mark. Logo 1 is a man leaning on a fence post with limited edition collector's edition on the rim. It was a series of 5 strikes consisting of the Assayer, Panner, Pony Express, Stagecoach and Train. Logo 2 is the same man leaning on a fence post but has ten dollar redeemable cash value on the rim. The set of 5 are the same Western Collector's Series as above. The last set of 5 are Logo 3 which is Bally Bart tipping his hat. The faces changed with this set. They are the Capital Building, Men Playing Cards, a Riverboat, Man Fishing From Raft and a Couple.

Circus Circus in Tunica only had 2 strikes. They were the Elephant and Lion. Both have the GDC mint mark. Circus Circus Casino is now the Gold Strike and is a very beautiful place.

Fitzgerald's Casino in Tunica had 5 different silver strikes. The first was Mr. O'Lucky. The strike was Logo 1 which has limited edition collector's series on the rim and Tunica Mississippi on the silver. The next strike was also Mr. O'Lucky but is Logo 2 which has ten dollar redeemable cash value on the rim and Tunica Mississippi on the silver. The last set of 3 are Logo 3. This logo has ten dollar redeemable cash value on the rim plus the Tunica Mississippi is on the rim. They are a Hat and Pipe, a 4 Leaf pot of Gold and a Pot of Gold with the Casino. They are all GDC mint mark. Fitzgerald's also had a \$40 silver strike. It is the casino with the GDC mint mark. There is no dollar value on the strike.

Harrah's Casino in Tunica had 10 strikes. The first 6 are Logo 1. This is the limited edition collector's series. They are a Genie on Carpet, Genie on Lamp, Riverboat with smooth water, Riverboat with wavy water, Riverboat Sidewinder facing right with smoke and Riverboat Sidewinder with Harrah's written in the sky. The next 4 are Logo 2 which is ten dollar redeemable cash value. They are the same 4 riverboats as above. They are all GDC mint mark.

Harrah's Mardi Gras Casino in Tunica had 6 strikes. The same 3 faces were used, these being Mardi Gras, Genie on Carpet and Sax Player. Three had Logo

1 which is the limited edition on the rim. The others are Logo 2 and has redeemable cash value on the rim. All are GDC mint mark. Harrah's Mardi Gras had 4 \$40 strikes. The Jester and Genie on a Carpet were issued twice, first with limited edition on the rim and then with \$40 redeemable cash value. All 4 are GDC.

Harrah's Casino in Vicksburg had some very interesting strikes. The first set was a Civil War Collector's Series. They depicted a Soldier with a Cannon and a Soldier with a Flag. These two faces were issued twice, once with limited on the rim and again with redeemable on the rim. They have the GDC mint mark. The next set of six are unique strikes. They are pictures of, I think, old gambling machines — Clawson 1896 Trade Check, Fey 1896 Three Spindle, Caille 1898 The Puck, Mills 1899 The Judge, Watling 1902 New Century Buffalo and Caille 1904 Roulette. These have an S mint mark.

Hollywood Casino in Tunica issued 20 strikes but actually there are only 10 different faces. Logo 1 strikes has limited edition on the rim and Logo 2 has ten dollar redeemable cash value on the rim. The ten faces are Humphrey Bogart, Bette Davis, W.C. Fields, Clark Gable, Laurel and Hardy, Groucho Marx, Marilyn Monroe, John Wayne, Adventure Slots and Egyptians. They all have the GDC mint mark.

Isle of Capri Casino in Vicksburg had 4 strikes. They are the Casino, Palm Trees, Parrot and Treasure Chest. They are all GDC.

Lady Luck Casino in Lula had 4 different strikes but they were released with both the limited and redeemable rims so the total is 8 strikes. The four faces are Sax, Drums, Jester and Keyboard. They are GDC. Lady Luck also released 4

\$20 strikes. They are the same Keyboard, Drum, Jester and Sax with GDC mint mark.

Strikes from Sam's Town Casino in Tunica are probably the hardest Mississippi strikes to describe so bear with me. Dennis and I documented 37 different strikes from Sam's Town. I'm sure there are more out there that we didn't get listed. The first 15 strikes listed are the Western Collector's Series. There are 5 faces but each face was issued with 3 variations. The faces are Assayers, Panner, Pony Express, Stagecoach and Train. Each one of these 5 strikes comes Logo 1 limited with no mint mark, Logo 1 limited with a GDC mint mark and Logo 2 redeemable with a GDC mint mark. The next 8 strikes were a Babe Ruth series. They all are Logo 2 redeemable. There are 2 different wordings on the rim. They are BRCS - Babe Ruth Collector Series and LEBRCS - Limited Edition Collector Series. I will use the letters in the descriptions of the strikes. They are Babe Ruth Running with Bat BRCS with GDC, Babe Ruth Face w/signature LEBRCS with no mint mark, Babe Ruth Batting w/background BRCS with GDC, Babe Ruth Sitting w/bat with GDC, Babe Ruth Sitting w/bat LEBRCS with no mint mark, Babe Ruth w/bat on Baseball w/name LEBRCS with no mint mark, Babe Ruth Batting no background LEBRCS with no mint mark and Babe

Ruth Running w/bat LEBRCS with no mint mark. The next 9 are Marilyn Monroe strikes. They are all Logo 2 redeemable. They also have different wordings on the rim. They are Marilyn Monroe Collector Series - MMCS and Limited Edition Collector Series - LECS. We have Marilyn Monroe Bust MMCS with GDC., Marilyn Monroe Upper Body Pose MMCS GDC, Marilyn Monroe w/hat MMCS GDC, Marilyn Monroe w/skirt MMCS GDC, Marilyn Monroe w/skirt w/name LECS no mint mark, Marilyn Monroe Full Body with written name LECS no mint mark, Marilyn Monroe w/top hat w/name LECS no mint mark, Marilyn Monroe Upper Body Pose w/name LECS no mint mark and Marilyn Monroe w/name around head LECS no mint mark. The next 5 are 5th Anniversary logo strikes. They are Tom Sawyer, Tom and Huck, Huck Finn (Dennis' great great grandfather), Riverboat Tall Stacks and Riverboat Short Stacks. These have no mint mark. There is also a set of 5 strikes which are probably prototypes. The only ones I know about were bought on ebay by Pam Corry and later traded to my buddy, Dennis. I guess I was twiddling my fingers when these sold. We were heading to Tunica and I thought they were a new release so I didn't bid. You snooze, you lose!! The strikes are Bass Fisherman, Pheasant Hunter, Hunter with Dog, Corn Field Hunter and Bow and Arrow Hunter.

Sheraton Casino in Tunica had 36 strikes. The first one was Logo 1 limited with no date. The face was the Sheraton Logo. The second was Logo 1 limited 1995 with the face being the Sheraton Logo. The third was Logo 2 redeemable 1996 with the Sheraton Logo face. These 3 are GDC. Next, they did the zodiac series of 12 Logo 2 redeemable with a GDC mint Mark. Then they did the zodiac series with Logo 2 redeemable with an S mint mark. The next nine were the Space Series consisting of the Soyuz Rocket, Gemini, Mercury, Hubble Telescope, Viking Lander I, Challenger, Galileo, Voyager I and Apollo. All with the S mint mark. The Sheraton issued 2 \$40 strikes. They both had the Casino face with one dated 1994 and the other 1995. The have the GDC mint mark.

Wow......that's it for northern Mississippi. I'll be back next edition with the remaining strikes from Mississippi. I'm definitely not looking forward to The Grand strikes. These are worst than Sam's Town. Non Nevada strikes are quite the challenge!
