The new \$300 Silver Strike has been approved by Nevada Gaming, a 6 ounce center with a copper ring which is gold plated. The first new \$300 Silver Strike will be released the weekend of the Four Queens Silver Strike Slot Tournament.

Sam's Town has six new strikes available for play, four are from the original 12 cars which were approved last year, 70 Firebird, &! AAR Cuda, &! Formula 400, 71 Roadrunner.

The membership roster as of January 2011 has 472 members.

Sunshine Mint has all rights to the Silver Strike program. As the El Cortez starts celebrating their 70th anniversary in May they plan on having two Silver Strike machines with four new house strikes and a red cap by June for CC&GTCC convention. Sunshine has been talking with the Mirage and Circus Circus about the installation of Silver Strike machines.


#### **Current Membership Report**

#### **Silver Strike Brochure Recruits New Members**

The "Collect Silver Strikes" brochure that was created by club member Bill Metten for distribution by the Four Queens is recruiting new members of the Silver Strikers club as hoped. The 1,500 brochures were placed in plastic holders near the strike machines by the casino's Director of Slots Shaun Webster in March 2013.

## How did the Treasure Island \$200 club auction come about?

Prior to this last convention, Bob Chambers, SS-661, donated a Treasure Island \$200 strike to the club with instructions that it was to be sold via auction at the club party which was to take place during the convention. The bidding was to start at \$1000 and the full selling price would go to the club. During the convention just prior to the club meeting Bob informed the incoming President that he wanted to modify his donation, he changed it to one Treasure Island \$200 strike a year for the next five years. Yes, a total of five Treasure Island \$200s. All proceeds from each auction are to go to the club.

Bob stipulated that the club was to auction off one strike a year each year at the club's party held during convention for the next five years starting with the current convention. The first one to be auctioned would have a starting price of \$1000 and the selling price of the first donated \$200 would be the starting price of the next auction. This would continue on for all five auctions, that is the last selling price would be the starting price for the next auction. It was decided that Bob would hold each strike until time for the auction and should the club cease to exist the donation of any remaining strikes would be cancelled.

The first auction was held at the club party during this last convention. Don Barton was the winning bidder with a bid of \$1450.00. Next year's auction will start at \$1450.00. It began in June of 2009. The first to bid and win one was Don Barton in June of 2009. So four were left. The next year, 2010, there were no bids. Then in 2011 no bids. Then 2012, no bids. Then Darryl and Sandra Yonesaki won one in 2013. That makes it a total of five years and of the five, two were auctioned and the proceeds were given to the club completing Bob's agreement.

However, Bob is willing to add one more year (2014) to help out the club.

#### **Previously Unknowns**

Strikes from the Flying Dutchman. Well, these error strikes may as well have been from that fabled ghost ship seeing as they posses no 'logo side' to promote the particular cruise ship and instead have two 'design' sides. The coin dies used to create these silver strikes were not intended to be used together. making these an error known as a 'mule' in the world of coin collecting, and there is no telling from which cruise ship line they may have been produced. An examination of the catalogs concerning non-Nevada strikes reveals that the four designs, Island Paradise, Lost Ship, Neptune, and Sunken Treasure have been utilized by the following cruise lines: Luxury Cruise Lines, Norwegian Cruise Lines, Princess Cruises, and Royal Caribbean. The Neptune design has also made an appearance on the Grand Princess Cruise Ship strikes. While the acquisition of these particular strikes seems to be difficult, based on searching the usual online resources, only one example of the Island Paradise/Neptune combination has been located at present but multiple examples of the Lost Ship/Sunken Treasure have been discovered over the past few years. As we have passed our second decade of the silver strike program, who knows what other curiosities may present themselves as we search for additions to our collections.
